ACTUALIDADES

As we remarked, it is not difficult to get the political parties to name committees to represent them in a discussion of candidates for the provincial governorships...

El Triunfo declares that the gentlemen selected to represent the zayistas are instructed to fail to agree to candidates acceptable to the miguelistas and the conservatives...

All which may be untrue, for what reason could the zayistas have in wanting Americans as governors, since the Yankees are not going to side with any party in that struggle?

Our supposition that no agreement could be reached was based, not on the belief that anybody would act in bad faith, but upon our knowledge of how difficult it will be to find Cuban governors in whom all can have confidence.

The New York Evening Post, a paper which enjoys the high esteem of commercial classes in the United States, which is anti-expansionist, and an advocate therefore of the independence of Cuba, on Friday, according to a telegram which appeared in El Triunfo, published an article in the course which it declares:

Nobody can deny that the immediate reestablishment of self-government under organic laws radical-

ly different from those which have heretofore held in Cuba, demands statesmen and men of affairs of a bigger calibre certainly than those who will take hold of the reins of Cuban government in 1909.

We do not reprint these statements because we are, or are not, in agreement with them, but we desire to hold them up as straws in the wind to indicate which way the draft may blow from Washington as soon as difficulties attendant on the forthcoming elections are passed.

And now as to the reception we ought to give the Nautilus:

Is it possible that any Spaniard regards the arrival of that vessel as a matter of little moment?

Is it possible that any person has been heard to remark that if the Nautilus gets a reception now as planned by a certain corporation every other schoolship of every other nation will have to be treated similarly hereafter?

Are we to believe that there are persons here of any social position and the slightest understanding, who do not realize that the arrival of this ship, the first Spanish war vessel to enter Cuban waters since the disaster at Santiago, is out of the ordinary, and who do not feel, with the clerks of Havana who took the initiative to prepare a welcome for the Spanish sailors, that the coming of the Nautilus is an event of transcendental importance?

No, surely we are not to believe this. Hearts that paused in their beating when the guns of Cabana announced the lowering of the flag of Spain from Morro's ramparts, cannot remain indifferent when that flag comes back again greeted by those same guns and bearing a message from the mother country to the dearest of her daughters.

When Cubans open their arms to welcome those Spanish marines like brothers, meaning to indicate by their attitude that between Cuba and Spain exists still the strong bond of blood relation, religion and language, there is no Spaniard here who can fail to contribute his share to the enthusiastic reception due the Nautilus. He will not seek to excuse himself on pretexts that might hold under ordinary circumstances, nor will he advance to cover his delinquency the fact that the situation of this country is none to cheer-ful just now.

THE GALLINGER BILL WHICH WAS SHELVED

Friends of the Measure Anticipated Its Successful Passage.—What It Promised.

The following article dated at Washington on April 2nd was written prior to the shelving of the Gallinger Bill mentioned. Contrary to expectations it did not pass the house but was disabed in committee and tenderly laid away for future reference:

President Roosevelt probably has won his fight for the enactment of legislation at this session of Congress to promote the country's ocean mail service. In his opening message to Congress the President strongly recommended legislation for a better and faster mail service to South America, the Philippines, and the Orient.

The bitterly hostile attitude toward ship subsidy legislation shown in the last Congress by the Democrats led many to believe that no change of phraseology, or, for that matter, change of essential features of the legislation, would have the effect of deminishing Democratic opposition this year.

When the Gallinger bill was received by the House it was referred to the Committee on Post Offices and Post Roads. In former years all ship subsidy legislation has been considered by the Committee on Merchant Marine and Fisheries.

The Gallinger bill is an amendment to the act of 1891, which provides four classes of vessels which may receive government aid for carrying the mails. It is proposed by the bill

to give authority to the postmaster-general to pay vessels of the second class at a rate per mile not exceeding the rate applicable to vessels of the first class. In other words, if this bill becomes a law the postmaster-general may enter into contracts to pay \$4 a mile for ocean mail service, on the outward trip, to all vessels having a speed of not less than sixteen knots an hour which carry mail to South America, to the Philippines, to Japan, to China, and to Australasia.

Before Senator Simmons consented to support the bill he insisted that it be amended to provide that the total expenditure for foreign mail service in any one year shall not exceed the estimated revenue therefrom for that year.

Advocates of the pending legislation have insisted from the start that government is now enabled to make a profit of \$3,000,000 a year by rendering an inefficient ocean mail service. All that was desired, it was said, was that the government should expend this profit in building up the ocean mail service.

In reporting the bill Senator Gallinger said that assuming that the Post Office Department would contract for a fortnightly service to Rio de Janeiro and to Buenos Ayres, to Manila, over two routes across the Pacific, one via Hawaii, one direct, and a service once in three weeks from the Pacific Coast to Australasia, the compensation to be paid under his bill would be \$3,630,320.

The Senate also agreed to an amendment proposed by Senator Bacon that if no contract is made for a line of ships between a port on the Atlantic Coast south of Cape Charles and South American ports, the postmaster-general shall, provided two or more lines are established from North Atlantic ports, require that one of the lines shall, upon each outward and homeward voyage, touch at least two ports on the Atlantic Coast south of Cape Charles.

POPULIST PARTY ADOPTS A PLATFORM

Discovered that Time Is Ripe for Revolution but the Inspired Matches Are Wanting.

St. Louis, April 3.—The platform to be submitted to the Populist convention was completed at daylight this morning, after an all-night session of the committee on resolutions. Much consideration was given to the money plank, and, when finally accepted by a majority of the committee, it was not satisfactory to the minority and a fight over its phraseology on the floor of the convention was certain.

As prepared by the committee, the currency plank declared that the issuing of money is a function of the government alone, that should not be delegated to any corporation or individual. The demand is made that money be issued direct to the people without the intervention of banks, and be a full legal-tender for all debts, public and private.

The plank on trusts demands that the government own and control the railroads and all public utilities which in their nature are monopolies. Ownership of the general telegraph and telephone lines, and a parcels post, are also called for.

Other planks submitted favored initiative and referendum, and the power to recall from office disloyal or inefficient representatives.

The enactment of legislation looking to the improvement of conditions for wage-earners.

Abolition of child labor and suppression of sweat-shops.

Exclusion from American shores of foreign pauper labor. Eight-hour work day and legislation in favor of safety appliances for workmen.
