GERMANY AND TURKEY INCREASE TRADE

BERLIN, Tuesday-Germany and Turkey have succeeded in forming trade agreements that will last for at least six years.

The agreements, which were consummated by private concerns in Germany and the Turkish government, provide that the companies will supply the Turks with material sufficient for the completion of the Sivas-Erzurum railway, a project which will take six years to complete.

The German firms are the Frederic Krupp works, the Otto Wolfe company, Linke-Hoffman and the Henschel concern. The German Steel Trust was instrumental in putting through the deal.

AUSTRIAN **STATESMAN** CRITICIZES

VIENA, Tuesday—Vice Chancellor Winkler, in the course of a political speech, has declared that German National Socialists must be content to run their own country and let Austria decide what form of government she is to have.

Winkler deplored the recent agitation against the Nazis in Austria, but blamed the Germans for causing it by attempting to dictate the Austrian policy of govern-

Although he requested Austrians to show more self restraint in the future, the vice chancellor stood up for their recent demonstrations on the ground that they were forced into self defence.





and raw materials. The undertaking did not seem beyond Russia's capacity to pay out of its surplus agrarian products. The collapse of world markets, however, upset all the calculations. The surplus did not suffice and the Kremlin began to deprive the population of necessities. The effect of this state of affairs on living conditions was well-nigh disastrous.

The second basic cause is in the excessive collectivization rate. That rate, as Communists insist, may have been unavoidable. The fact remains that it created a «socialized sector» before the country was ripe for it and before the government could reward the collectivized peasants for their sacrifice of private land with a more ample
