German Intervention To Check
Frontier Stabilization Plan Denied In Rome; London To See Flandin, Laval.

London, Wednesday-The Fran--Italian negotiations for a cen ral European security pact to guarantee the independence o Austria and the frontiers of the uccession states are at a stand till today.
The French cabinet is meeting oday to discuss the deadiock, ac cording to a message from Paris. Premier Flandin and Foreign Mi nister Laval are to visit London next week to discuss question earing on the proposed pact.
Sir John Simon, whose presen ce in Cannes on vacation gave ise to rumors that he intended o visit Rome and discuss the scheme with the Duce, is still on he Riviera and has gone to MonCarlo, as he had planned. He 5 of course being kept informed of the course of the negotiations.

## The Kingfish

A despatch from London ap－ pearing in other collumns on this page gives the interesting new that while Senator Huey P．Long of Louisiana，self－stylued «King fishs，is regarded in England with considerable amusement，his ant ics are also taken with some ser－ iousness．
It is true that Huey Long is duly elected Senator of the United States．It is also true that he is and has been Governor of the sov－ ereign state of Louislana，and has held many other political positions in that state．
But it is not true that Huey Long is considered anything more than an unmannerly，tasteless， and crooked if clever buffoon，by the rank and file of the intelligent people of the United States．
To say that Huey Long is a typ－ ical American politician is far from the truth，and to say that his career is considered a model or that he himself commands the respect of the country is a libel on the average American citizen．
Huey Long is the product of a peculiarly rotten political system of his native state．He rules that state，and has for some years，with a rod of iron．But he does not rule the United States，nor will his brand of loud braying politics ever get to the top－if the American people retain their senses．
Huey＇s latest antics with his Louisiana University have gained much publicity．So did hls famous assauit in the washroom of a swank Long Island club for ladies and gentlemen，out of which he was unceremoniouslly thrown．For after all，the American people like to Iaugh，and Huey is something to laugh at when he isn＇t some－ thing to deplore
In his own state Long is a power of sorts，but in the rest of the country he is a laughing stock And even Louisiana，long writh－ ing under the Long yoke，is a present doing its level best to get rid of its prime fester．
Let Britons laugh at Long with Americans，but let them not make the mistake of thinking that Huey P．Long is considered seriously by Americans or that he is the model of the present－day American statesman．America has enough to contend with in these troubled times without having still more added．

British Public Views Antics Of Kingfish Long With Amusement Mingled With Some Respect

LoNDon．－British public opinion observing with considerable in－ erest and amusement the political «reforms» of Senator Huey P．Long of Louisiana．
The «Kingfish» is one of the best known among American pol－ ticians here，where news of his activities always is lengthily rep－ orted．
General consensus seems to be that «despite his buffoonery Long s an astute demagogue，＞as the News Chronicle wrote when the intention of the «Kingfish» to tand as a Presidential candidate in 1936 recently was reported． Although other metropolitan newspapers refrained from com menting on the news of his «ab solute dictatorships in Louisiana through the speedy passing of 4 bills，the liberal Manchester Guar－ dian came out with a stinging editorial． «Senator Huey P．Long，dicta－Louisiana．》
tor，or «kingish»－in his own term －of the State of Louisiana，is a demagogue with a sense of hum－ or，» it wrote．«He knows and uses all the tricks of the American pol－ itical boss without fear or scruple． No one can tell just how far he is mere selfseeking politician，how far he really believes in his crude remedy for the present discont－ ents．
«In a state where people take life easily he is a whirl of en－ ergy．In a country where public speaking tends to be pompous and funereal he is a vigorous and racy speaker．He has no dignity to lose enged in the Supreme Court，on the ground that they are against the Constitution；but then ther is nothing to suggest that they are．Senator Long＇s Presidential aspirations are not yet taken ser iously．But ten years ago no one ever thought to see him rule even

## FRANEE AND ITALY Poland Hails Treaty halt Negotiations FOR SECURITY PACT With Germany As A (Diplomatic Wonder)

The announcement of the check in the negotiations caused much surprise here, and hopes are stil entertained that the setback will prove only temporary. Assurances that the major difficulties have been overcome have been given both in Rome and in Paris, and give ground for the hope that the differences which have arisen will prove susceptible of adjustmen.
The Times attributes the hitch to the belief that Italy has become aware of the opposition of Germany and Hungary to the project for stabilizing the frontiers created by the peace treaties in central Europe. Reports tha German intervention was respon sible however are being flatly contradicted in Rome.
Mussolini, it is stated, neve considered the possibility of leav ing Germany out. He is convince that the four power pact of June 1933, which was signed by Grea Britain, France, Italy and Ger many, should remain the basis of international peace
Difficulties have also arisen, the Times points out, in connec tion with the settlement of colofontiers between France and ftaly in Africa. The whole quest ion therefore is being further con sidered in order to determine whe ther the terms of the proposed pact can be modified to the gene ral advantage.
Franco-Polish relations ar strained in consequence of the Fanco-Italian scheme, according to the official Warsaw paper $G a$ zeta Polska. Poland, according to that journal, is unable to sign the pact, as she refuses on principle to participate in projects about which she was not consulted ne forehand.
