SPANISH POLICE BILL

MADRID, Monday

The drafting of the bill for the organisation of the police forces of Spain, which Don Eloy Vaquero, the Home Minister, has had under consideration for some time is now complete, and copies of the draft have been circulated among the members of the cabinet for their consideration.

The Guardia de Seguridad and the Guardia de Asalto, are to be combined into a single force, according to Señor Vaquero, who explained the main lines of the measure to press representatives here. The Cuerpo de Seguridad thus formed will include local, mounted and mobile units, the last named corresponding to the present guardia de asalto.

The entire corps will be under the command of a general or colonel of the army; who will be directly responsible to the Director General de Seguridad. Otherwise army officers will be seconded for service in the corps only when suitable candidates for promotion are not available in its own ranks.
