

RADICAL CHANGES IN ITALIAN CABINET

Rome Friday

A clean sweep of the entire Italian cabinet was made last night in a decree announcing resignations and changes.

Included among the resignations handed to Pemier Mussolini are those of the Ministers of Finance Education, Public Works, Agriculture, Justice, and Land Improvement. Official circles however state that the changes are only part of the periodical «changing of the guard.»

Nevertheless, every cabinet officer except Signor Mussolini himself is now on the doorstep instead of inside. Almost immediately following the announcement of the «resignations» came another announcement giving the names of those appointed in the places of the dismissed ministers.

Included are Admiral Thaon di Revel as Minister of Finance, Signori de Veochi as Minister of Education, Rossono as Minister of Agriculture, Razza as Minister of Transport and Solmi as Minister of Justice.

At the same time new undersecretaries have been appointed in all Boncampagni, who has been made of Corporations Bottai is succeeding to the governorship.
