## THE ELECTIONS

As the result of a lightning Cabinet reshuffle on Monday, Spain started 1936 with yet another new Government.

The Ministerial crisis was the sixth of the year 1935, which in this respect holds the record for the four years of the Second Republic.

Señor Portela Valladares, who formed a non-party Government with the mission of holding elections on December 14, resigned on Monday morning. At 9:30 p.m. on the same day he submitted the list of his new Cabinet to President Alcalá Zamora.

The reshuffle resulted from a coming elections. The Premier, neutrality and rejected the alliance with the parties of Right, including the Monarchists, which was favoured by the dissentients. Agriculture; Don Filiberto Villa-
