«A la una de la tarde de hoy ha comenzado en Gibraltar la entrega de las fragatas *Almansa* y *Vitoria*; á las 5 de la tarde, segun comunica nuestro representante el Sr. Millan Carch se habia izado en ellas el pabellon nacional, terminando la entrega.»

La entrada en Tolosa del General en Jefe del Ejército del Norte Sr. Moriones ha sido acogida con gran entusiasmo. El Gobierno continúa recibiendo felicitaciones de todas las provincias por su actitud enérgica en favor del orden. Segun informes que el Gobierno tiene, reina gran desacuerdo entre los principales cabecillas carlistas producido por las ventajas que en el Norte obtienen nuestras tropas.»

Lo que he dispuesto se publique en Boletin oficial extraordinario para conocimiento de los habitantes de esta provincia.
