Ethiop Spies Report Italians Prepare Invasion

CARDINAL BOURNE, ENGLISH CATHOLIC ARCHBISHOP, DIES

Great Londoner's Successor In See Of Westminster May Receive Hat When Thomas More Is Canonized.

LONDON, Wednesday — Cardinal Bourne, Roman Catholic archbishop of Westminster, died here early yesterday morning, aged 73. The late cardinal was a Londoner by birth, and almost the whole of his life was spent here. He became a bishop at the early age of 35, an archbishop at 42, and a cardinal at 50. His eminence played an important part in the affairs of the nation, particularly in educational matters. His public utterances were rare, but in times of crisis, such as the world war and the general strike, his attitude was unequivocal and effective.

VATICAN CITY, Wednesday—Cardinal Bourne's successor as archbishop of Westminster will be chosen by the Pope from among the names suggested by the consistorial congregation.

Monsignor Arthur Hinsley and Monsignor Charles Duchemin are among those mentioned as possible successors.

Jailed Red Deputy Is Near Death Following Fall Thought Suicide

OVIEDO, Wednesday—Don Teodomiro Menéndez, Socialist deputy to Cortes, who is being held for trial in connection with the October revolt, today is lying seriously injured in hospital here, and is not expected to live.

His injuries were caused by falling from a gallery into the inside court of the prison. At first it was believed that he had attempted to commit suicide, but when he recovered the power of speech he explained that he felt ill while walking along the gallery, faint on the rail, and suffered an attack of syncope.

Señor Menéndez was on his way to give an interview to a reporter, by permission of the prison authorities, at the time of the accident. He was carried to hospital in a comatose condition.

The first medical examination suggested that he had broken both his spinal column and his pelvis. Further examination by x-rays showed that neither fracture had occurred, but revealed other severe internal injuries.

Soldiers were placed around the hospital bed to guard against a repetition of what was thought to be a suicide attempt. The theory

FRANCE AND ITALY HALT NEGOTIATIONS FOR SECURITY PACT

German Intervention To Check Frontier Stabilization Plan Denied In Rome; London To See Flandin, Laval.

LONDON, Wednesday—The Franco-Italian negotiations for a central European security pact to guarantee the independence of Austria and the frontiers of the succession states are at a standstill today.

The French cabinet is meeting today to discuss the deadlock, according to a message from Paris. Premier Flandin and Foreign Minister Laval are to visit London next week to discuss questions bearing on the proposed pact.

Sir John Simon, whose presence in Cannes on vacation gave rise to rumors that he intended to visit Rome and discuss the scheme with the Duce, is still on the Riviera and has gone to Monte Carlo, as he had planned. He is of course being kept informed of the course of the negotiations.

Poland Hails Treaty With Germany As A «Diplomatic Wonder»

WARSAW, Wednesday—The German-Polish non-aggression pact is being hailed here today as a «diplomatic wonder» and an enormous contribution to the peace of the whole world.

The extravagant phrases appear in a political review of the past year which is published in the semi-official *Gazeta Polska*. Its editor, Colonel Miedzinski, is responsible for the tagging of the pact as a wonder, and asserts that it parallels Poland's famous non-aggression pact with the Soviet Union.

According to the colonel, the latest agreement with Germany is putting an end to the long-standing customs war between the two countries, and has also resulted in a change of both official and public opinion in Germany with regard to Poland.

While lauding the advances brought about by the agreement with the Third Reich, the editor of the *Gazeta* is also careful not to offend other powerful European countries. He states that the pact with Germany is in no way a contradiction to the friendly relations of Poland with France, Rumania, and the Soviet Union.

FRESH COMPLAINT OF ROME'S ACTIONS IS SENT TO LEAGUE

Troop Movements On Border Alarm Addis Abbaba Since Other Signs Show Colonial Expansion Project.

ADDIS ABBABA, Wednesday—Ethiopian spies report that further movements of Italian troops are taking place on the frontiers of both Eritrea and Italian Somaliland, and a tense situation prevails here today in consequence.

The Ethiopian government has made a further complaint to the secretary general of the League of Nations on the troop movements on its borders.

The Italians are building roads to the Ethiopian frontier in both their neighboring territories, according to the spies. That sudden burst of activity is regarded with the deepest suspicion in government circles here, where Italy is regarded as being desperately anxious for colonial expansion, and eager to provoke a conflict.

Neither Eritrea nor Italian Somaliland, it is pointed out, is very valuable. The incorporation of the slice of rich Ethiopian territory which intervenes between the two colonies however would make all

Italians To Try High Speed Express Motor Trains After Seeing Successful German Trials

ROME, Wednesday—The streamlined express motor train has passed the experimental stage and is here to stay, in the opinion of Italian railroad experts. For that reason the Italian State Railways, having watched the performance of the famous «Flying Hamburger» with care, will shortly install an aerodynamic train.

The German express has traveled 270,000 kilometers successfully in a regular run and keeping to a strict time-table. It has proved popular and reliable, and it has been imitated in various forms in other parts of the world.

The new Italian aerodynamic train will have 1,200 horsepower engines and is designed to run at a regular speed of 100 miles per hour.

Trains will be composed of three coaches and will be reserved for de luxe service. They will be fitted with special ventilation plants, since the high speed of the trains will prevent the opening of windows while they are running.

It is predicted that the journey between Rome and Milan will be cut down to four and a half hours. If the first run is successful, others

London «Times» Celebrates Century And Half Of Existence As Oldest German Paper Closes

LONDON, Wednesday—One hundred and fifty years ago The Daily Universal Register appeared on the streets of London. Today the same journal is one of the most powerful and respected newspapers in the world, known as the *London Times*.

The anniversary of the first issue of the journal was celebrated here in the paper's offices on January first, and with the publication of a special number of 30 pages which gives a sketch of the paper's history.

The story of the *Times* begins with its foundation in 1785 and is

unbroken until the present day. It affords an interesting survey of the developments in newspaper production during that period, while the files of the newspaper give an excellent account of the history of England and of the world during those years.

The prestige of the *Times* has steadily mounted, resisting frequent attacks on the part of the government and of rival newspapers. Today it is generally considered a semi-official organ of the government, the most famous of all British newspapers. Its corres-

The Kingfish

A despatch from London appearing in other columns on this page gives the interesting news that while Senator Huey P. Long of Louisiana, self-styled «Kingfish», is regarded in England with considerable amusement, his antics are also taken with some seriousness.

It is true that Huey Long is a duly elected Senator of the United States. It is also true that he is and has been Governor of the sovereign state of Louisiana, and has held many other political positions in that state.

But it is not true that Huey Long is considered anything more than an unmannerly, tasteless, and crooked if clever buffoon, by the rank and file of the intelligent people of the United States.

To say that Huey Long is a typical American politician is far from the truth, and to say that his career is considered a model or that he himself commands the respect of the country is a libel on the average American citizen.

Huey Long is the product of a peculiarly rotten political system of his native state. He rules that state, and has for some years, with a rod of iron. But he does not rule the United States, nor will his brand of loud braying politics ever get to the top—if the American people retain their senses.

Huey's latest antics with his Louisiana University have gained much publicity. So did his famous assault in the washroom of a swank Long Island club for ladies and gentlemen, out of which he was unceremoniously thrown. For after all, the American people like to laugh, and Huey is something to laugh at when he isn't something to deplore.

In his own state Long is a power of sorts, but in the rest of the country he is a laughing stock. And even Louisiana, long writhing under the Long yoke, is at present doing its level best to get rid of its prime fester.

Let Britons laugh at Long with Americans, but let them not make the mistake of thinking that Huey P. Long is considered seriously by Americans or that he is the model of the present-day American statesman. America has enough to contend with in these troubled times without having still more added.

British Public Views Antics Of Kingfish Long With Amusement Mingled With Some Respect

LONDON.—British public opinion is observing with considerable interest and amusement the political «reforms» of Senator Huey P. Long of Louisiana.

The «Kingfish» is one of the best known among American politicians here, where news of his activities always is lengthily reported.

General consensus seems to be that «despite his buffoonery Long is an astute demagogue,» as the News Chronicle wrote when the intention of the «Kingfish» to stand as a Presidential candidate in 1936 recently was reported.

Although other metropolitan newspapers refrained from commenting on the news of his «absolute dictatorship» in Louisiana through the speedy passing of 44 bills, the liberal Manchester Guardian came out with a stinging editorial.

«Senator Huey P. Long, dicta-

tor, or «kingish»—in his own term—of the State of Louisiana, is a demagogue with a sense of humor,» it wrote. «He knows and uses all the tricks of the American political boss without fear or scruple. No one can tell just how far he is a mere selfseeking politician, how far he really believes in his crude remedy for the present discontents.

«In a state where people take life easily he is a whirl of energy. In a country where public speaking tends to be pompous and funereal he is a vigorous and racy speaker. He has no dignity to lose. Long's measures might be challenged in the Supreme Court, on the ground that they are against the Constitution; but then there is nothing to suggest that they are. Senator Long's Presidential aspirations are not yet taken seriously. But ten years ago no one ever thought to see him rule even Louisiana.»

The announcement of the check in the negotiations caused much surprise here, and hopes are still entertained that the setback will prove only temporary. Assurances that the major difficulties have been overcome have been given both in Rome and in Paris, and give ground for the hope that the differences which have arisen will prove susceptible of adjustment.

The *Times* attributes the hitch to the belief that Italy has become aware of the opposition of Germany and Hungary to the project for stabilizing the frontiers created by the peace treaties in central Europe. Reports that German intervention was responsible however are being flatly contradicted in Rome.

Mussolini, it is stated, never considered the possibility of leaving Germany out. He is convinced that the four power pact of June, 1933, which was signed by Great Britain, France, Italy and Germany, should remain the basis of international peace.

Difficulties have also arisen, as the *Times* points out, in connection with the settlement of colonial frontiers between France and Italy in Africa. The whole question therefore is being further considered in order to determine whether the terms of the proposed pact can be modified to the general advantage.

Franco-Polish relations are strained in consequence of the Franco-Italian scheme, according to the official Warsaw paper *Gazeta Polska*. Poland, according to that journal, is unable to sign the pact, as she refuses on principle to participate in projects about which she was not consulted beforehand.

realizing that it is being looked upon with some misgiving by those nations.

Skirting the sore subject of the Eastern Locarno pact, which Poland broke up by refusing to accept it, the editor states that the time is not yet ripe for forming a final opinion on this scheme. It is not, he says, its presentation alone which caused Poland to be wary, but still more vital considerations concerning Poland's security, but which the colonel fails to point out specifically.

The agreement with Germany is considered a forward step, according to competent observers, by other parties than Poland and Germany. It should serve as a model, it is thought, for Lithuania, which has long had the most unfriendly relations with Germany, and perhaps even pave the way for an eventual agreement there.

The Italian government was reported recently to be considering a plan to unite the two colonies under a single administration, forming a single territory to be known as Italian East Africa. That intention is accepted here as the clearest sign of aggression to come.

The Italian government has consistently refused to accept the Ethiopian government's offer of arbitration on the frontier incidents of last month, during which Italian Somaliland troops attacked the escort of the joint British and Ethiopian frontier commission. It has also suspended all negotiations for settling the Italian-Ethiopian frontier on the pretext that reparation for alleged attacks by Ethiopian troops on Italian frontier posts must be made first.

The Blessed Thomas More was Henry VIII's chancellor, and both he and Cardinal Fisher were beheaded for opposing that sovereign's efforts to make himself head of the church in England.

Señor Menéndez had convinced himself that the court martial before which he was shortly to appear would condemn him to death, and that the sentence would be carried out. Neither his counsel, Don Aurelio Matilla, nor his relatives and other visitors were able to shake that conviction.

The trial has of course been postponed. Latest reports indicate that the doctors at the hospital have hope of saving their patient, although he is still in a state of complete prostration.
