Flight To Frontier

At Kavalla 3.000 rebels, including many officers, surrendered unconditionally. The retreat is rapidly degenerating into a disorderly flight, according to the reports received at the War Office, many of the rebel officers deserting their troops in a desperate attempt to cross either the Bulgarian or the Turkish border.

General Kondylis, who arrived at Kavalla yesterday evening, is to return to Athens by air this morning, as the operations in Macedonia are considered to be finished, apart from some local actions. He reports in a telegram to Premier Tsaldaris that the rebel officers cleared out the National Bank in Kavalla, seizing more than

Three death sentences and a total of 260 years penal servitude are the penalties demanded by the public prosecutor in the trial of the Communist leader Fritz Schulze, which began before the Sum-

mary Court here yesterday. Schulze was one of the leaders of the Communist risings in Hamburg in 1922 and 1923. H_e is charged with committing three murders,

being implicated in fifteen others. and planning five more. The public prosecutor is dem-

anding the death sentence for each of the three murders which the defendant is alleged to have committed himself. Fifteen years penal

servitude are asked for each of the crimes to which he is accused of being an accessory, besides a total of thirty-five years on other char-






