## LABOUR SERVICE

### GERMAN CHIEF'S SPEECH

LEIPZIG, Friday

The reintroduction of conscription does not in any way detract from the necessity for labour service and its aims, Major Hierl, Reich Leader of the Labour Service, declared in the course of a speech delivered at the German Labour Front Congress now meeting here.

Stating that it was erroneous to regard labour service as a substiaker emphasised that these were very different things and could not be replaced by each other, the defence force's duty being to proect German territory from attack, while the labour service was a practical application of National-Socialism guaranteeing that national sentiment would never again be split by class antagonism.

«Thus in future,» Major Hierl continued, «the labour service must precede the military service. Whoever has the honour to be a

## LORD PRIVY SEAL IN-MOSCOW

#### TO TALK WITH STALIN

#### **PRECEDENTS**

Moscow, Friday

Mr. Anthony Eden, who arrived here yesterday from Berlin, is to meet M. Stalin this afternoon.

This will be the first occasion on which the real ruler of Soviet Russia will have discussed international relations with the representative of a foreign Government. Such matters have hitherto been left exclusively in the hands of M. Litvinoff, People's Commissary for Foreign Affairs.

M. Litvinoff created another precedent last night when he proposed the toast of the King of England at a banquet in Mr. Eden's honour. It was the first time that a Soviet Comissary had observed such a ceremony in his own coun-

## STATEMENT ON

London, Friday

Sir John Simon stated that the Anglo-German conversations in Berlin revealed a considerable divergence of opinions between the two Governments in a short declaration which he made in the House of Commons here yesterday.

The Foreign Secretary added however that the result of the meeting was undoubtedly valuable, in so far as both sides are now in a position clearly to understand their respective standpoints—a process which he termed indispensable for any further progress.

Sir John was received with demonstrative applause when he rose to make his statement. He began by saying that the House was well aware that the visit to Berlin was one of several exploratory journeys now being undertaken to various foreign capitals on behalf of the British Government.
