# ROBBERY SIX GANGSTERS ARRESTED

MADRID PAYROLL

# **MONEY RECOVERED**

Six of the seven men concerned in the killing of a municipal employee and robbery of the City payroll outside Madrid City Hall on November 30 have been arrested, and all but 80,000 of the 1,5000,000 odd pesetas stolen have been recovered, according to reports from Madrid.

The arrested men are Casimiro Chaves Ramos, who is regarded as the leader of the gang; Florencio Izquierdo López, who planned the robbery; Ramón Fernández Cortinas, who was the first to fire at the murdered workman and snatched the bag of notes he was carrying; Mariano Salas Castroverde; Fernando Salvadores Prieto, who drove the taxi used in their escape; and Manuel Sánchez Canalejas, who stood sentry over the taxi driver from the moment he was stranded at a lonely spot in the suburbs until the operation was completed.

They were arrested on Sunday, and most of the stolen money was recovered the same day. More than 500,000 pesetas were found in the house of Ramón Fernández, 100,000 under a mattress in that of Sánchez Canalejas and 700,000 in a hiding place near the Calicanto bridge on the Madridas an accomplice.

His Holiness invested the new mantles in a solemn ceremony them their Cardinal's hats in a second ceremony on Thursday.


Among the new Cardinals are Monsignor Tedeschini, Nuncio in Madrid; Monsignor Gumá y Tomás, Archishop of Toledo and Primate of the Spains; Monsignor Marmaggi, Nunci in Vienna; Monsignor Magione, Nuncio in Warsaw; Monsignor Kasper, Nuncio

in Paris; and the Archbishop of Prague. The rest are Italians, so that the Italian Cardinals are now in a majority.

The Sacred College now consists of sixty-eight members, of whom thirty-seven are Italians. The maximum number possible is seventy

Before Monday's Consistory the number was down to forty-eight. Of these twenty-there were Italian and twenty-five foreign. Rumour has connected this bringing up to strength of the Sa-
