Real Job Under Roosevelt

WASHINGTON.-If Franklin D. Roosevelt carries into the White House one of his earlier ideas, he may make an important handy man out of his vice-president, John N. Garner.

When Roosevelt was running for vice-president in 1920, he was quoted in a magazine article as suggesting that the Vicepresident should not be condemned to sit in lonely grandeur, but instead should be put to work. One suggestion was to give the Vice-president a roving commision to help the Presi-

His idea was to make the Vicepresident an assistant instead of a social figure who dines in society by night and sits in the Senate by day. Such a change would not necessarily require legislation.

«If there ever a waste of manpower it would seem to be here,» Roosevelt is quoted as saying in an articule in the Saturday Evening Post of October 16, 1920. «Here is a man paid \$12,000 a year who traditionally has complained that he has next to nothing to do.»

Some here thought they saw indications during Roosevelt's debt visit that Speaker Garner would emerge as an important figure in the next administration. He was the most silent of all vice-presidential candidates. But when Roosevelt came here Garner was with him almost contantly. He, it is said, undertook to keep Roosevelt from weakening on the debt issue.

PARIS. - The Latin Quarter is looking less skeptically at some of the pathetic tales in Murger's «Vie de Bohéme».

Until recently the picture of Mimi's student companions burning their manuscripts to keep warm was considered melodrama. But this season, which brings nearly 34,000 students to the Sorbonne and other schools here, that incident now approaches realism.

In past years most of the student representatives of 30 or 40 nations along the «Boul'Mich» were at least comfortably dressed and well fed. They ate five and six-franc dinners, they could buy books along the quais, occasionally hear Moliere and Racine at the Theatre-Francais, and afford a yearly spree at the Quat'z Arts ball.

Today the situation in the Latin Quarter presents a somber picture. Gaiety has gone, bemaintain existence.

not unusual now to see young artists in rags, their models in tatters and young men and women enroute to their classes in slippers.

Students scurry from their bleak hotels and begin the scholastic day with a cold croissant and a glast of weak coffee. The luckier ones amplify this at noon with a vegetable from the nigborhood delicatessen to which you bring your own plate.

Tobacco and alcoholic beverages, manufactured and sold without payment of government taxes, constitutes the trade of the bootlegging fraternity of Mexico who, officials say, have developed organizations of magnitude.

In closing its doors, the «La violeta» cigar factory of Vera Cruz, at one time considered the second largest industry in Mexico, announced that competition of clandestine cigar manufacturers, who eluded the revenue agents, forced the factory to cease operations. The cigar manufactory, established more than 30 years ago, had employed a crew of hundreds of persons, at the plant and thousands of families on the tobacco plantations.

PEIPING LETTER

PEIPING, China. - Peiping's population now has reached the 1,500,000 mark and the increase of nearly half a milion souls chiefly is due to refugees from Manchuria. When the capital of China was "moved from Peiping five years ago it was expected that shortly the foreign legations would follow Chinese officialdom to Nanking and that this city would become of little consequence, largely because it lacks trade and commerce.

But Legations remain here and at present there is no indication that they will be transferred to Nanking. Ministers and members of Legation staffs are able to travel to Nanking and Shanghai at their convenience and there appears to be no disposition to abandon the costly, elaborate and confortable properties in the Legation quarter

The Japanese action in ousting Marshal Chang Hsue-liang from Mukden more than a year ago served to give Peiping a new lease on life. The extension of of Japanese military influnce throughout Manchuria sent hundreds of Chinese officials and their numerous followers scurrying here. During recent months the guerrilla warfare in Manchuria has caused addition al refugees to flock here with the result that the city is facing an acute housing shortage.

Peiping rich in historical, cultural and educational associations, bids fair to profit from the increase in population and even from the plight of the destitute. For in an effort to care for the unemployed Chinese officials are following the example of western lands and they are speeding public works" projects in order to provide jobs for the workless.


