and the probable early visit of Pierre Laval, the French foreign minister, to that capital. It will be remembered that when Premier Flandin and Laval met Simon in Paris on December 22 the Franco- Catalans' New Ruler President To Urge Italian negotiations were among the subjects they discussed during the course of a general review of the European situation.

Laval's expected journey and the substantial progress towards an agreement reported from Rome and Paris have created an excellent impression in London. British diplomacy, as is well konwn, has been directed for a considerable time at facilitating by all the means in its power the achievement of an understanding between France and Italy as one of the essential factors in the stabilization of the European situation, and therefore present parleys.

The nature of the Frencyh compromise regarding the Italian press to consist essentially in the division of central European organization into two parts.

Rome is said to envisage a plan to guarantee Austrian independence, to which Italy, Germany, Hungary, Czechoslovakia and Jugo-Slavia are to subscribe. In the case of Germany and Hungary not signing the protocol simulteneously, their places would remain vacant, but the agreement would nevertheless become valid immediat-

That first diplomatic move would be followed by a second consisting of the conclusion of a sort of central European guarantee pact. It is to be modeled on the pattern of the Balkan pact, but would also be signed by France and Rumania.

Italy and the Little Entente aristocratic Catalan family, countries would thus reciprocally guarantee their frontiers, which is the chief aim of French dip-Iomacy.
