LATEST WORLD NEWS IN BRIEF

LONDON, Saturday

The General Election campaign has now entered its last stage with the end of the series of political broadcasts, the last of which was given last night by the Prime Minister, Mr. Stanley Baldwin, for the Government.

Public interest at present centres on one or two contests which leading personalities are engaged. The Prime Minister was returned unopposed, but his colleague and predecessor at the head of the National Government, Mr. J. Ramsay MacDonald, is engaged in what it is generally agreed will be a hard fight at Seaham Harbour, a mining constituency.

Mr. MacDonald refused to consider a safe seat. He is opposed by Mr. E. Shinwell, Secretary for Mines in the last Labour Government. As National Labour candidate Mr. MacDonald is assured of the unqualified support of the Conservative voters, but the attitude of the Liberals is doubtful. His majority at the last election was just under 16,000 in a total vote of about 52,000.

The Home Secretary, Sir John Simon, has represented Spen Valley since 1922. His majority at the last election was just over 4,000, and Labour, which won the seat


