REICH GOVERNMENT Vienna Paper Raps POLICE IN CONTROL

Uniformed Members Of Force Ordered To Quit Membership In Steel Helmets And Storm Troops Detachments.

Berlin, Wednesday - Extra-legal power, which since the Nazi revolution in Germany has caused nuch trouble and has been a socree of irritation to a great number of Germans, will in the future be curbed.

This was made clear in an order issued yesterday by Hitler's right hand man Goering in his capacity of home minister.

Of utmost importance in attempting to check the power of the police is that part of the order which requires all policemen to mmediately give up membership the Nazi Steel Helmets or the lationalist Storm Troops now hat these detachments have been abordinated to the courts for lisciplinary offences.

Truce With America Can a general strike technically went into effect throughout Spain Tuesday, there is today surprisingly little disorder in the nation's industry.

> A number of bombings have occurred througout the Pen'nsula, but there is nothing to indicate that the outrages were planned by organized labor. They are believed to have been the work of individuals trying to cause trouble for the government.

> In Barcelona, hot-bed of Socialism and Communism, police had little difficulty in maintaining order. A group of rowdies attempted to overturn a bus and others smashed some tram car windows, but they were quickly dispersed.

> Several bombs were set off in Luco, but little damage was done and order was quickly restored.

STUDIO STAR DUST

Hollywood.—A star's preparation for making a motion picture is no less exacting than that of the director, the producer or the allied studio departments necessary to film production.

If actors and actresses appear to be having a good time in a picture, it's chiefly because they are able to mask their real emotions. A star has no easy time of it before production, and even less during filming.

Weeks before The Warrior's Husband began. Elissa Landi, blonde Viennese star, was occupied with experiments in make-up,fitting costumes, taking screen tests and rehearsing. Even the relatively small matter of make-up often requires days, while the trying days of rehearsal seen end-

Once in production, the work doubles. Miss Landi estimated she averaged 18 hours a day, starting at 7 a.m. For two hours she donned make-up and the heavy suit of armor which was her costume as an Amazonian chief.

At nine she was on the set, hastily re-reading lines and going through quick rehearsal to refresh her mind. Scenes are often filmed many times to catch the one perfect «shot». Between scenes there is little chance for rest because of necessary readjustments to make-up, costumes and

The day goes on like this to 7 p.m., interrupted only by an hour for lunch. After camera work ended, Miss Landi talked at length with Director Walter Lang on the next day's work and then went with him to see the «rushes» the results of the previous day's shooting.

It's 9:30 p.m. by now, but still therewas wardrobe to be checked and studying lines for the next scenes. A great life.

Original Americans Seen As Parents Of Asiatic Tribes

BILLINGS, Mont.-North Amerirican Indians may have been the parent race of Asiatic tribes now wandering over Mongolia's vast deserts and plains, according to a recent article by Dr. Thomas B. Marquis, authority on tribal cus-

Dr . Marquis pointed out that many customs and habits of the Indians resembled those of present day Mongolians.

The Mongolian women must do most of the household and camp work—as did the squaws. Dr. Marquis cites their method of tanning hides as an example of remarkable similarity between their habits.

Mourning habits and supersti-Lawrence's New York, skippered tions of the Indians greatly resemble those of Asiatic tribes, Dr. Marquis said.

Many Biblical and early Greek references to eastern people and their habits show a striking simithose of aboriginal Americans, Dr. Marquis said. That such similar customs should have developed separately is hardly credible, he declared, but rather would indicate a close connection between the races.

Mongolian tepees, love of the plains, horsemanship, and household habits offer a close parallel to those of the North American Indians, the author said.
