One of the most famous newspapers, if not the most famous, in the world is celebrating the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of its founding this month.

The London Times is not old as newspapers go, but it is sufficiently venerable to have obtained the solid respect of the British nation and of the rest of the world.

It has had many ups and downs in the course of its career, but it has never descended from its strictly respectable position. Although Northeliffe was at one time one of the principal owners, it survived that ordeal. Today the Warden of All Souls' College and the Archbishop of Canterbury, Cosmo Gordon Lang, are ex-officio members of the Board of Trustees. Without their approval the ownership or shares in the ownership of the Times cannot change hands. Thus is the policy of the paper safeguarded.

Generally considered the most while. conservative large newspaper in the world, the Times has nevertheless always progressed with the times. It was the first newspaper anywhere to use radio in the reporting of news, during the Russo-Japanese war in 1907.
