SAARBRUECKEN, Thursday

The solemn ceremony of transferring the executive power over the Saar territory from the International Saar Governing Commission to the German government will take place tomorrow afternoon in the offices of President Geoffrey Knox of the Governing Commission, it was announced yesterday.

Those present in the offices of the president will be Reich Minister of the Interior Frick, as official representative of the German government, and Baron Aloisi of the League of Nations Saar Commission.

Baron Aloisi will open the ceremony by delivering a speech in French which will be immediately translated in German and broadcast, while the subsequent address by Dr. Frick in German will be translated into French and sent out over the air at once. The historic act will be broadcast by all German radio stations linked together in a great national hookup for the occasion.

MOSCOW FIRE MANY KILLED AND **INJURED**

Moscow, Thursday A terrific explosion of a high pressure air compressor in one of

the largest factories in the capital has resulted in the death of thirty -three workers, while several hundred more are stated to have suffered more or less serious injuries in the accident yesterday.

The explosion occured in the «Krassin» pencil factory. It caused a conflagration which spread rapidly through the entire three story building, cutting off the retreat of a score of workers, all of whom perished in the flames. Others were killed by the force of the explosion and hundreds were badly burnt or

injured by falling masonry. All of the fire brigades in Moscow were immediately called out to fight the blaze. Before any headway could be made, however, the flames destroyed not only the factory building but four adjacent buildings.

The government has ordered a strict investigation into the disaster, which is believed due to gross negligence. Practically all accidents and failures in services or manufacturing are now laid to that cause, rather than to defective apparatus or workmanship.

ETHIOPIA TO THE PRESS **«NO INTENTION OF ATTACKING**»

ENVOY'S SPEECH

Rome, Thursday

«I swear on my honour that the Ethiopian Government never thought, and never will think, of attacking the neighbouring Italian colonies of Somaliland and Eritrea,» declared the Ethiopian Chargé d'Affaires here yesterday, when he addressed an international gathering of press representatives, emphasising that this is a «solemn moment in Ethiopia's history».

The Emperor of Ethiopia, he informed his audience, had already made an identical declaration in personal letters addressed to the King of Italy, as well as to Signor Mussolini. In spite of this, the Italian Government continued to despatch troops and war material to the colonies adjacent to Ethiopia, justifying these serious military preparations as neccessary for protecting those two colonies.

Troops Unnecessary

«Italy can save herself the trouble of shipping further troops and munitions,» declared the Chargé d'Affaires. He added that he and was operated at the start with had repeatedly pointed out to the Italian Government that Ethiopia had neiher the desire nor the intention of attacking Italy's colonies.

> «I will go still further,» continued the representative of Ethiopia, «and assert that if the last man and the last gun were withdrawn

from Somaliland and Eritrea, Ethiopia would not touch one stone of these two Italian colonies.

«It is untrue that Italian troops have been attacked by Ethiopian soldiers, or even by nomadic tribes,» he went on, «and if Italy holds the opposite view, then the treaty of friendship and arbitration concluded between Italy and Ethiopia in 1928 provides the possibility of settling all disputes




