1. Part of the province of Tigré, with the towns of Adowa, Adigrat and probably also Makale to be ceded to Italian Erytrea, while Axum remains Ethiopian.

2. The province of Ogaden to become Italian.

3. Ethiopia to grant Italy special facilities for economic settlement near Bari, this territory to come under a special administration but remain under the sovereignty of the Ethiopian Emperor.

4. Ethiopia to receive a «corridor» in Erytrea to the port of Assab, with the right to build a road and a railway line thereto.
